# 2023 Instrumental Music Program



For many students, a musical journey begins at Upwey High School that develops into a lifelong passion.

Playing a musical instrument is a unique and enriching experience. Students at Upwey High School enjoy the opportunity to learn a musical instrument and experience success and pleasure in learning with others. They develop musical repertoire and musical literacy through lessons, practise, ensemble rehearsal and performance, attaining technical proficiency and musical depth. Students develop historical knowledge and learn about themselves through their music practice, building self-expression. Learning music also has a range of other benefits including improving concentration, memory and self-discipline.

In 2023 the Upwey HS Music Camp will be held **Wednesday 26 April – Friday 28 April** at the **Mt Evelyn YMCA**. Students will travel by bus to Mt Evelyn on the Wednesday morning, stay two evenings and return to school on Friday afternoon. The camp provides the opportunity for students to rehearse intensely with their ensemble, partake in a variety of workshops and activities and bond with the Upwey Music community. This camp is a crucial part of our Music curriculum and we expect all Music students to attend. The camp cost will be confirmed early in 2023. Please contact the Director of Music if there are any issues around your child's involvement. Medical / Permission Form will be available early in 2023.

By joining the Instrumental Music Program students participate in weekly lessons on their chosen instrument, attend ensemble rehearsals and have many performance opportunities.

Enrolment in instrumental music classes consists of a flat rate of \$450.

# 2023 Instrumental Music Program



### **Enrolment is subject to the following conditions:**

Tuition fees outlined within the 2023 enrolment form are levied to assist with tuition costs not covered by the Department of Education and Training. This fee is due by the dates outlined on the 2023 enrolment form and is **non-refundable**. If paying 50% of fees upon enrolment the remaining balance is due and payable by 17 February 2023 otherwise removal from lessons will apply. Please note that our yearly fees contribute toward the cost of our Instrumental Music Teachers and are heavily subsidised by the school.

- 1. As with all other subjects the student's work will be subject to reporting and assessment each semester.
- 2. Every student is required to be a member of at least one ensemble. Students are expected to attend weekly rehearsals (held before or after normal school hours, or at lunchtime) and play in all performances.
- 3. Each student must undertake a regular and consistent practise program. The Music Department asks for full parental support for the practise schedule which will be recommended by the teacher.
- 4. Weekly 50 minute lessons, normally in small groups, are given during school hours. Students are withdrawn from class at a time that rotates throughout the school day to avoid missing the same class each week.
- 5. Timetables are subject to change and whilst every effort is made to provide plenty of notice, it is the student's responsibility to check their lesson times each week.
- 6. Students are enrolled into a whole-school music program which is enriching and exceptional value due to part subsidy from the Department of Education and Training. As many Instrumental Music teachers are committed to several schools, they cannot make up lessons missed due to illness, public holidays and other school events.
- 7. Students are expected to purchase their own sundries, including, strings, tuition books, drum sticks/percussion mallets (All ensemble music is supplied by the school).
- 8. Parents and students must sign the authorisation and undertaking statements on the 2023 enrolment form to be enrolled in the program.
- 9. A letter from parents to the Director of Music must accompany any request for the cessation of study.
- 10. Absences are to be notified in advance whenever possible, by contacting the appropriate Instrumental Teacher or the Director of Music.
- 11. Students will be allocated to an ensemble after the start of Term 1 according to playing ability, instrument, and the overall structure of the Music Program and enrolments. Ensemble allocations are final but may be re-assessed at the end of Semester 1. Playing in an ensemble is a valuable aspect of learning an instrument and is a part of the curriculum of the Upwey HS Instrumental Music program. Attendance at all rehearsals and concerts is required to take part in the program.

#### Fee structures and payment

All fees must be paid in full or a 50% deposit payable upon enrolment. The balance to be finalised by 17 February 2023. Please complete a student payment form and include your debit/credit card details if you require us to deduct your payment automatically. This is essential to ensure adequate staffing is arranged for 2023.

**Enrolment in the UHS Instrumental Music Program is a financial commitment for the entire year**. The Instrumental Music Program is a user pays optional extra-curricular program. Funding covers payment for the instrumental teachers, the purchase of music resources, and repairs and maintenance to the school owned equipment.
